Certificate III in Carpentry

Course Overview:

This is a trade qualification delivered through face-to-face training for carpenters in residential and commercial workplaces. It includes setting out, manufacturing, constructing, assembling, installing and repairing products made using timber and non-timber materials. Occupational titles may include:

Carpenter - Commercial

Carpenter - Formwork

Carpenter - Residential

State and territory jurisdictions may have different licensing, legislative, regulatory or certification requirements. Relevant state and territory regulatory authorities should be consulted to confirm those requirements.

Completion of the general construction induction training program, specified in the Safe Work Australia model Code of Practice: Construction Work, is required by anyone carrying out construction work. **Achievement of CPCWHS1001 Prepare to work safely in the construction industry meets this requirement.**

However, the RTO requires candidates to meet its admission requirements prior to enrolling into this qualification to ensure that they have the required skills and knowledge to successfully complete the qualification at this AQF level. This consists of:

Course Entry Requirements: Applicants must be at least 18 International students also need English proof: IELTS score of 6 (for listening, reading, writing and speaking) or equivalent in line with the Department of Education and Department of Home Affairs (DHA) Pearson Test of English (PTE) Academic 47-54, TOEFL IBT 60-78, CAE Scale 169-175 Results older than two years are not acceptable (for offshore applicants)

Academic Requirement: Completion of Year 12 VCE or equivalent overseas qualifications. Additionally, having a strong interest in the building and construction industry and possessing adequate literacy and numeracy skills are important.

Mode of Delivery: Face to Face Classroom, Workshop sessions
