Certificate III in Solid Plastering

Course Overview:

This is a trade qualification for **solid plastering work in residential and commercial construction environments**. It provides both core construction skills and specialist training in applying plaster, cement, and related finishing materials to interior and exterior surfaces. Solid plasterers create smooth, textured, or decorative finishes on walls and apply render systems to external building surfaces.

State and territory jurisdictions may have different licensing, legislative, regulatory, or certification requirements. Relevant state and territory regulatory authorities should be consulted to confirm those requirements.

Completion of the general construction induction training program, specified in the Safe Work Australia Model Code of Practice: Construction Work, is required for anyone carrying out construction work. Achievement of **CPCWHS1001 – Prepare to work safely in the construction industry** meets this requirement. The achievement of this unit is embedded within the course structure, ensuring students are industry-compliant from day one.
